Get involved for CLEAN WATER... Volunteer Programs available through the Iowa Department of Natural Resources

IOWATER, Iowa's volunteer water quality monitoring program, provides Iowans an opportunity to monitor water resources in their own communities. Volunteers are provided with training and monitoring equipment, and can then monitor wherever and whenever they choose. The program brings people closer to the landscapes that surround them and encourages them to develop a sense of place within their own watersheds. 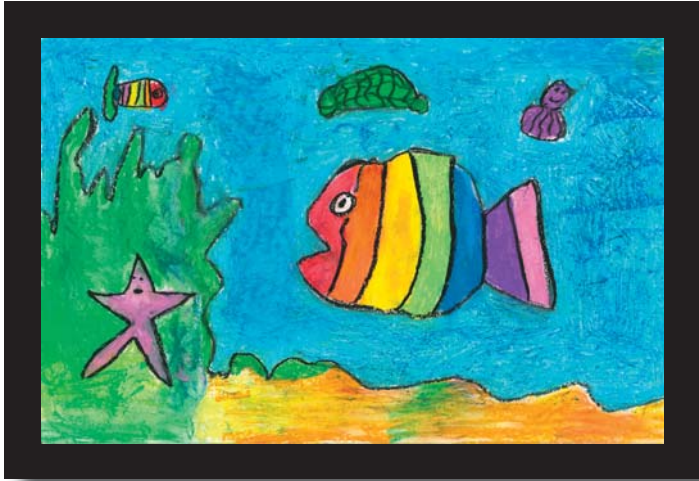
Project AWARE (A Watershed Awareness River Expedition), is the Iowa Department of Natural Resources' annual weeklong, volunteer river cleanup and watershed awareness event. Hundreds of Iowans spend anywhere from a day to an entire week paddling and hauling trash from Iowa's waterways while learning about and enjoying our water resources from the seat of a canoe. Through hands-on experience, water quality monitoring, and organized on-the-river and evening educational opportunities, volunteers not only learn about water quality, wildlife, and recycling, they experience them firsthand. River of Words®

Every year, River of Words® conducts an international environmental poetry and art competition for youth aged 5 to 19 in grades K-12, in affiliation with The Library of Congress Center for the Book. This free contest is designed to help youth explore the natural environment and cultural history of the place they live, and to express what they discover through poetry and art. Iowa entries not chosen as finalists or grand prize winners in the international contest are returned to IOWATER, where they are judged in a statewide IOWA River of Words® Environmental Poetry and Art competition.

The IOWATER Volunteer Water Monitoring Program of the Iowa Department of Natural Resources coordinates the IOWA River of Words® Environmental Poetry and Art competition. This year, over 530 students from Iowa entered the contest, either through their schools, community art centers, local libraries, or on their own. Because of the large number of quality Iowa entries, we accepted the generous offer of the Cedar Rapids Museum of Art to host a juried River of Words® IOWA Environmental Poetry and Art Exhibit. Thirty-seven works of poetry and art were selected to be included in this exhibit.

We hope you enjoy these efforts by Iowa's youth to explore and understand our environment, and to express their experiences through art and poetry.

Mary Swander
2009-2010 Poet Laureate of Iowa

Ms. Swander received her undergraduate degree from Georgetown University and is a graduate of the Iowa Writer's Workshop MFA Program at the University of Iowa. She is a professor of English and a Distinguished Professor of Liberal Arts and Sciences at Iowa State University.

Memoirs *Out of this World* and *The Desert Pilgrim* are Swander's best known works. Her best-selling book of poetry, *Driving the Body Back* (which she later adapted for stage), is set during homesteading times in Iowa. *Dear Iowa*, a musical Swander co-authored with composer Christopher Frank, is set during the Civil War. Both stage works have been produced across the Midwest and on Iowa Public Television. Ms. Swander performs her own work and gives solo readings throughout the United States. Currently, she is touring her play *Farmscape*, a documentary capturing the changing rural environment. She has been a regular commentator on WOI radio in Ames, Iowa, as well as National Public Radio's Sunday Weekend Edition.

Ms. Swander has won numerous awards including an Iowa Author's Award, a Whiting Award, a National Endowment for the Arts Grant for the Literary Arts, two Ingram Merrill Awards, the Carl Sandberg Literary Award, and the Nation-Discovery Award.

Mary Swander lives in an old Amish schoolhouse, raises geese, goats, and a large organic garden, and plays the banjo.
